Only one is complete, measuring $6.1 \times 3.2 \times 1.1 \mathrm{~cm}$. Others may have attained a length of as much as 8.0 or 9.0 cm . and a width of 4.5 cm .

Technique of manufacture The specimens in this type are the product of percussion flaking.

Comments. Unfortunately, this type must rest allmost en-
tirely upon its distribution within the deposits at 45 KT 28 , where it is a characteristic artifact in all the phases but the very latest. Comparative specimens are restricted to 0lcott type materials found along the Puget Sound littoral (Butler 1961; Thompson 1961).
